



QUICK CRIME PREVENTION TIPS Get Involved

- Get involved with your Neighborhood Watch program. If your neighborhood doesn't have one, contact your local police district station's community resource officer to find out how to start one.
- Make a block map with names, addresses and home and work telephone numbers for each of your neighbors. Exchange the maps with your neighbors. Discuss how to do a telephone calling tree to transmit important information throughout your block. At a minimum, know your neighbors on either side of you, across from you and behind your house. Post the block map by each telephone in your house. Discuss how to use the block map with your children.
- Get involved with your neighborhood association. Find out what is being done and how you can help.
- Get involved by hosting a block party and meeting your neighbors.
- Get involved by watching for suspicious activities and persons in your neighborhood. Take action when necessary: report incidents to the police, organize a graffiti cleanup, or tell a crime victim about resources available to help, such as The Denver Center for Crime Victims.
- Get involved by meeting the police department's Community Resource Officer for your district.
